Developed in response to the youth employment rate for individuals with disabilities, the School Transition Employment Program (STEP) is a job training/transition program for high school students with special needs. STEP provides students with transferable vocational education and relevant social skill development as part of their Individualized Education Program (IEP), improving future opportunities for competitive employment and/or post-secondary education. STEP will provide students with real world, hands-on training through a unique opportunity to explore a number of different career paths. Programs are customized to fit the needs and preferences of those participating.

STEP's highly trained employment specialists and job coaches work side-by-side with junior and senior year high school students, their families, and their Individual Education Plan team to assess the student's strengths, preferences, and interests. Using these assessments, STEP develops opportunities for students at local job sites from our network of participating businesses.
